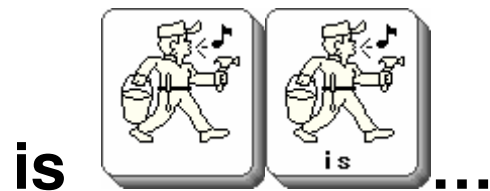
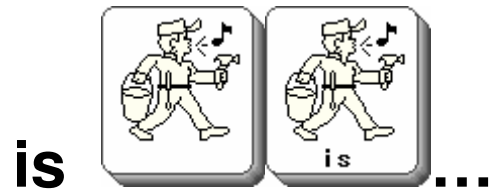
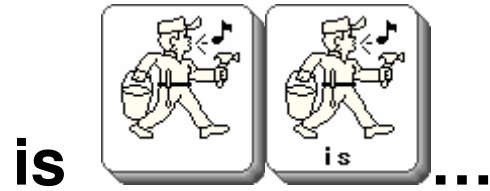
After reading Things that are the Most in the World, by Judy Barrett, have the students write their own book of things using adjectives. Students can be as creative/funny as they like, or as serious/studious as they like. This is a good chance to let their sense of humor show! The target sentence beginnings for a Vanguard/Vantage 45 location follow. The students can illustrate their work by drawing or cutting out pictures, or the students can do their work directly on the computer using AAC keys software to allow them to use their AAC device as a keyboard (writing like they talk) and clip art to illustrate.





Note: AAC keys software is available as a download from the AAC institute. Schools vary on their download policies, so this may not be an option for the school. Check with your local district to be sure.
